





Opening Conference

- Mission/goals/scope of services
- Staff and responsibilities/oversight/ 24-hour access
- Clinical practice guidelines,
 CDC, AAMI, etc.

Individual Tracer Methodology

- Patient assessment
- Medication administration
- High risk areas: sedation, sterilization, high level disinfection

Infrastructure

- Training, orientation, and competence
- Data collection, aggregation/evaluation/ reporting
- Leadership oversite, investigation, and response

Confirm expectation/clarify if misunderstood.




